

Inside the Mind of a Successful Medical Interpreter



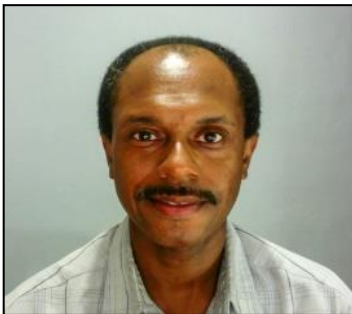
